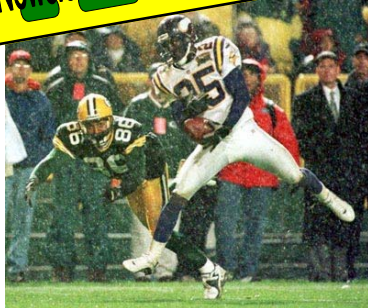

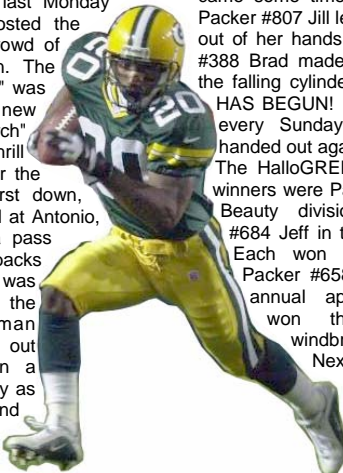
Vikings' WR Chris Carter shows us how to play in NFL with class by kicking the Packers' Antuan Edwards like an infant.

Bay. It's a situation that has made a nervous Vikings' owner ready to wheel and deal. McCombs told the media, "I made them an offer they can't refuse." In a press release, McCombs outlined a plan that he claimed would maintain the league's integrity and also allow the Vikings to buy their NFL championship. Under the plan, should the Vikings not win Super Bowl XXXV in January, then the team that did win would get thirty-five million dollars in exchange for the NFL title, trophy and rings. Regardless of who wins the Super Bowl, the league itself would receive fifteen million dollars in exchange for being recognized as World Champions on January 28, 2001. The NFL released a statement saying that the Championship was not for sale, but that a "buttload" of money could certainly change their minds. "But, we may differ on what defines a 'buttload,'" said the statement from the league offices. McCombs was quick to counter that this was of course just an initial offer and was open to negotiation. He said, "I am glad the league is at least being open-minded. I see this as a win-win situation for all involved, I finally get my Super Bowl Championship and everybody else gets a buttload of cash." The NFL is holding off on making any decisions until they understand how big a "buttload" of money McCombs is talking about. "If it's anything close to the size of Vikings Coach Dennis Green's butt," an NFL official said, "we're in!... ah...um... the money... that is."

Kissimmee Kent's Korner

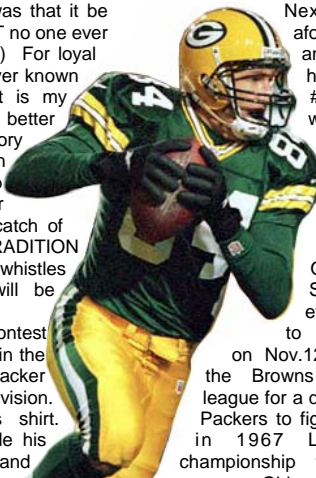
